Students will design and create their own watch, including the movement for the suitable parts, casing, and hands. Working independently with mentoring from instructors.

Admission Requirements

- Age: Candidates must be over 18 years old.
- Language Proficiency: Must be able to speak and write English fluently (IELTS 5.0 6.0 or CEFR B2).
- **Previous Experience:** No prior watchmaking experience required, but previous professional experience outside the watchmaking field is preferred.
- **Entrance Exam:** Candidates will undergo a bench test to evaluate their abilities and manual dexterity.

• Location: Espoo, Finland

• **Tuition Fee:** €25,000 per year, total €50 000 for the whole course.
