

Taster Course and Bench Test for The Independent Watchmaker Course

All candidates of The Independent Watchmaker Course must participate in a 3-day **Taster Course and Bench Test** prior to being considered for admission.

The Taster Course and Bench Test is held at The Finnish School of Watchmaking in Leppävaara, Espoo, Finland (Vanha maantie 11, 02650 Espoo). The sessions commence at 8 a.m. and conclude at 4 p.m. Optional Meet and Greet event is arranged after the test.

The Taster Course and Bench Test fee is 480€ (including VAT) and it covers instruction, materials, lunch, and coffee/tea during the three days.

Process steps:

1. **Please enroll in the Taster Course and Bench Test via Enrolment Form (www.kelloseppakoulu.fi)**
2. You will be contacted by phone to discuss the details of the bench test and answer any questions you may have regarding the course, transportation options etc.
3. The Finnish School of Watchmaking will send an invoice for the Taster Course and Bench Test.
4. Upon payment, you will receive a confirmation and welcome letter to the Taster Course and Bench Test.

Taster Course and Bench Test Schedule and Content

The course and test consist of three full days of instruction and evaluation, giving you insight into the teaching style and required skills at our school. The school is introduced along with practical experiments ranging from basic manual skills exercises to practice with a pocket watch. Additionally, there is an optional Meet and Greet possibility with some Finnish independent watchmakers.

Overall Schedule for the three days

8:00 – 11:30 Instruction, tests, and interviews
11.30-12.30 Lunch
12.30-16:00 Instruction, tests, and interviews

Day 1: Introductions & Bench test begins

The Finnish School of Watchmaking introduced
- The Foundation, tradition, pedagogy, community
Bench test begins / filing exercises

Day 2-3: Bench test continues

Instructions + work on a pocket size watch

Optional Day 4: Meet and greet Finnish Independent Watchmakers



Evaluation Criteria

- Motivation
- Basic hand-eye coordination and utilization of tools
- Willingness to acquire new knowledge and receive guidance
- Collaboration skills
- Ability to follow the teaching in English

Please Note the Admission Requirements

- Age: Candidate must be over 18 years old.
- Language Proficiency: Must be able to speak and write English fluently (similar to level IELTS 5.0 - 6.0 or CEFR B2).
- Previous Experience: No prior watchmaking experience required, but previous professional experience outside the watchmaking field is preferred.
